Local Charity: Little Miracles Cambridge, Ely and Newmarket

Little Miracles is an award-winning Cambridgeshire and Suffolk-based charity and parent-led support group for families with children that have autism, additional needs, disabilities and life-limiting conditions. It is based in Ely Community Centre, on the Cambridgeshire and Suffolk border, reaching out to Cambridge, Ely, Newmarket and their surrounding villages. Currently they are working with over 700 children.

Their projects focus around social and communication development skills and supporting sensory needs whilst maintaining a fun aspect for the children. Where possible, projects will always include an educational element and will consider such areas as the arts and environment whilst utilising technology and any resources that provide opportunities for different types of interaction. Recent projects include the building of a sensory garden, a sensory soft-play area, a video media suite and the setting up of a role-play and imagination project. Sessions for families are free as monies are raised through fundraising activities.
